Recommendation by Conference Committee Regarding Child Labor Provisions of White House Conference, 1931

NEW JERSEY CONFERENCE ON CHILD HEALTH AND PROTECTION SECTION III – EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Committee C - Child Labor - Mrs. Isabelle M. Summers, Chairman

WHEREAS: In accordance with the White House Conference recommendation which requires, "for every child protection against labor that stunts growth, either physical, or mental, that limits education, that deprives children of the right of comradeship of play and job", therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the recommendations of the Migratory Child Survey Commission be enacted into law at the earliest possible opportunity, and be it further

RESOLVED: That efforts be made, by legislative enactment if necessary, to set uniform standard for the employment of children in street trades, such standards to cover age and hours of employment, enforcement of such regulations to be in the hands of the school authorities through the attendance departments, and be it further

RESOLVED: That sufficient personnel be maintained in the Bureau of Women and Children of the Department of Labor to properly enforce the existing child labor laws, and that additional safeguards be placed among minors with respect to dangerous occupations.
