Thank you for your recent letter.

We are going through an extraordinary and deeply troubling period for the citizens of our country as well as for the Congress. Regardless of one's feeling about the President, basic fairness and the interests of the nation require, I believe, that the House impeachment inquiry go forward with thoroughness and dispatch. I believe that most members of the House Judiciary Committee, which acts in the first instance, are keenly aware of their Constitutional responsibilities.

As a member of the Senate, which will sit in judgment if the House votes for impeachment I, too, have a responsibility—an obligation not to prejudge the matter and to refrain from comment on the substantive questions which are involved. This is, and has been, hard to do. I hope that you will understand.

Best wishes in your endeavor to obtain the "Citizenship In the Community" requirement.
