Dear Senator Case,

Thank you for your thoughtful letter. I was impressed indeed by your reasoned arguments. To me, one of the most heartening aspects of today's political life is the interest taken by young people in public affairs. And I was appreciative, of course, of your support of some of my recent efforts in the Senate.

Although I did not make a wide public statement after my recent meeting with the President, I did state that there was a candid discussion of ways in which the facts could be brought out based on common agreement that only bringing out the facts would satisfy the public concern. The President indicated he agreed with the objective and expressed appreciation of the willingness of those present to enter frankly into the discussion. It remains my own view that the situation calls for an independent prosecutor pursuant to pending legislation of which I am already a sponsor.

It was good of you to write and let me have your views and I hope you will be doing that from time to time.
