Newark Campus Quiet After Bomb Threat

NEWARK (AP) — The Rutgers campus here remained quiet following a bomb threat Monday and the pouring of a foul-smelling chemical on the floors of the classroom building seized last month by a Negro student organization.

An administration spokesman

said a telephone caller Monday warned of bombs in Conklin and Boyden Halls, as well as the Student Center, but a check of the buildings by campus security police disclosed nothing.

Earlier in the day, a stink-bomb mixture of ammonia and bleach forced the delay of some classes in Conklin Hall—a major classroom building seized last month by members of the Black Organization of Students. The group occupied the building for three days to press their demands on the administration.
